NOTICE OF VACANCY

MINNEAPOLIS CHARTER COMMISSION

The Minneapolis Charter Commission currently has two vacancies.

Qualified voters of the City of Minneapolis are eligible to submit applications for appointment to the Charter Commission. The Chief Judge of Hennepin County District Court, the Honorable Kevin Burke, will review applications and will appoint persons to serve on the Minneapolis Charter Commission. Selected persons may be appointed to fill an unexpired term or to begin a full four-year term, but no persons may be appointed to serve as a commission member for more than two successive four-year terms.

The Charter Commission may propose amendments to the Minneapolis City Charter on its own initiative or at the request of the City Council. Charter Commission meetings are held on the first Wednesday of each month in the Council Chamber, Room 317 City Hall, at 4:00 p.m.
